

**OUTCOME OF GRANT APPLICATIONS FROM CUMNOCK & DOON VALLEY
MINERALS TRUST MEETING HELD ON 15 NOVEMBER 2019**

Continued Application from 5 April 2019 meeting

5.1 MT 32/19 - St John's Church Community Hall - £14,740;

5.2 **Declaration of Interest**

Councillor John Bell declared an interest in the undernoted application and withdrew from the meeting.

MT 39/19 - New Cumnock Golf Club - £26,000.

Councillor John Bell re-joined the meeting at this point.

5.3 MT 40/19 - Cumnock Bowling Club - £10,000;

5.4 MT 42/19 - Glenafton Athletic Football Club - agreed to defer this application and seek the view of the Steering Group which had been set up to take forward the New Cumnock Community Sports Hub to ascertain the communities view regarding the direction of Community Sports Hub and its relation with Glenafton Athletic Football Club.

It was further agreed that once this information had been received, it would be circulated to Trustees for their view with the option of reconvening a Special Meeting, if required;

5.5 MT 46/19 - New Cumnock Angling Association - £9,480, subject to written permission from the landowner in relation to the siting of the portacabin. It was further agreed to advise the group that they should consider submitting an application to the Renewable Energy Fund in respect of funding for the weed cutter and to seek advice from the Council's External Funding Officer regarding funding for the access vehicle;

5.6 MT 47/19 - Muirkirk Golf Club - £2,360;

5.7 MT 48/19 - EPIC East Ayrshire Pipe Band Academy - £3,368 on the condition that the equipment is used for children within the Cumnock and Doon Valley area only and that if the group should dissolve, the equipment remains within the Cumnock and Doon Valley area;

5.8 MT 49/19 - Glenafton Amateurs Football Club - £10,000, subject to the receipt of a signed and dated copy of the Group's Constitution and written evidence that the lease for the Pavillion had been finalised;

Councillor John Bell, seconded by Councillor Elaine Dinwoodie, moved as an amendment an award of up to £500, subject to the receipt of an invoice from Ayrshire Roads Alliance detailing final costs.

On a division by a show of hands, the amendment was carried by 5 votes to 4.

It was thereafter agreed that Groups could apply for energy costs in respect of Christmas lights projects up to a maximum of £200.
